

Manchester Shirt Card

Set(s): none

Accessories:

5 ½ x 8 in Very Vanilla c/s

4 x 5 ½ Manchester DSP – wide stripes

3 ½ x 2 inch. Artichoke for collar

3 ½ inch, ¾ inch Twill Tape

¾ inch, ¾ inch Twill Tape

Regal brads

Paper piercing tool

1. Fold the vanilla cardstock in half to form a card. It will only be 4 inches wide, but it will still pass for a standard card.
2. Adhere the Manchester paper to the front of the card
3. Take the piece of Artichoke paper and trace the collar pieces (the long one once and the front collar template twice)
4. Adhere the long piece of collar centered at the top flat to the cardfront and then the two front collars with Dimensionals™. Before you tack down the collars permanently, adhere the tie.
5. Cut one end of the 3 ½ inch twill piece like a tie end and then with the other end, put a lot of monoadhesive and gather it. Tuck the gathered end under the collars. With the smaller ¾ x ¾ inch twill tape, put mono on one entire side and fold back the edges into the glued side to hide all threads. Adhere that just under the front collar.
6. Use the paper piercing tool in order to reach the collar edge and set artichoke brads. Secure any loose parts of the collar with monoadhesive.

For the tie 'knot', entirely cover one side of the twill square with monoadhesive and gather all the edges in to the middle
